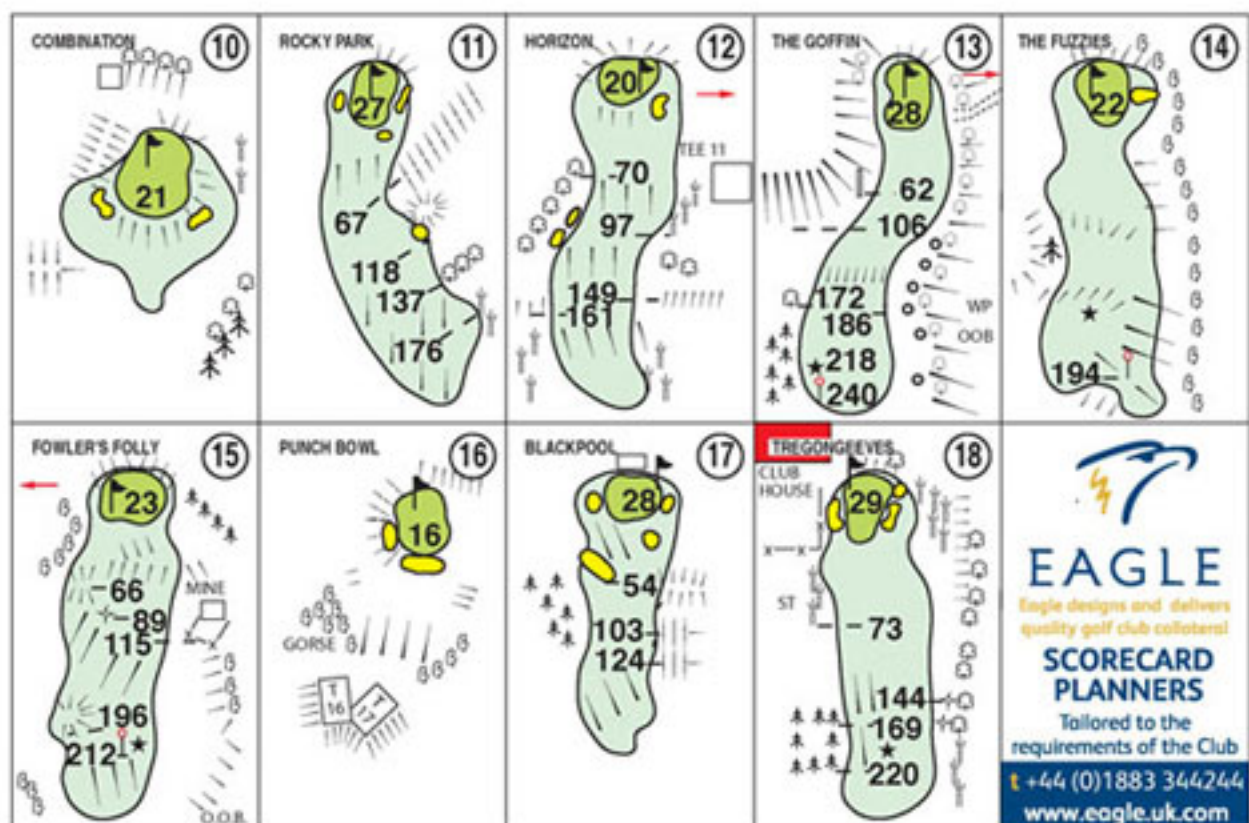
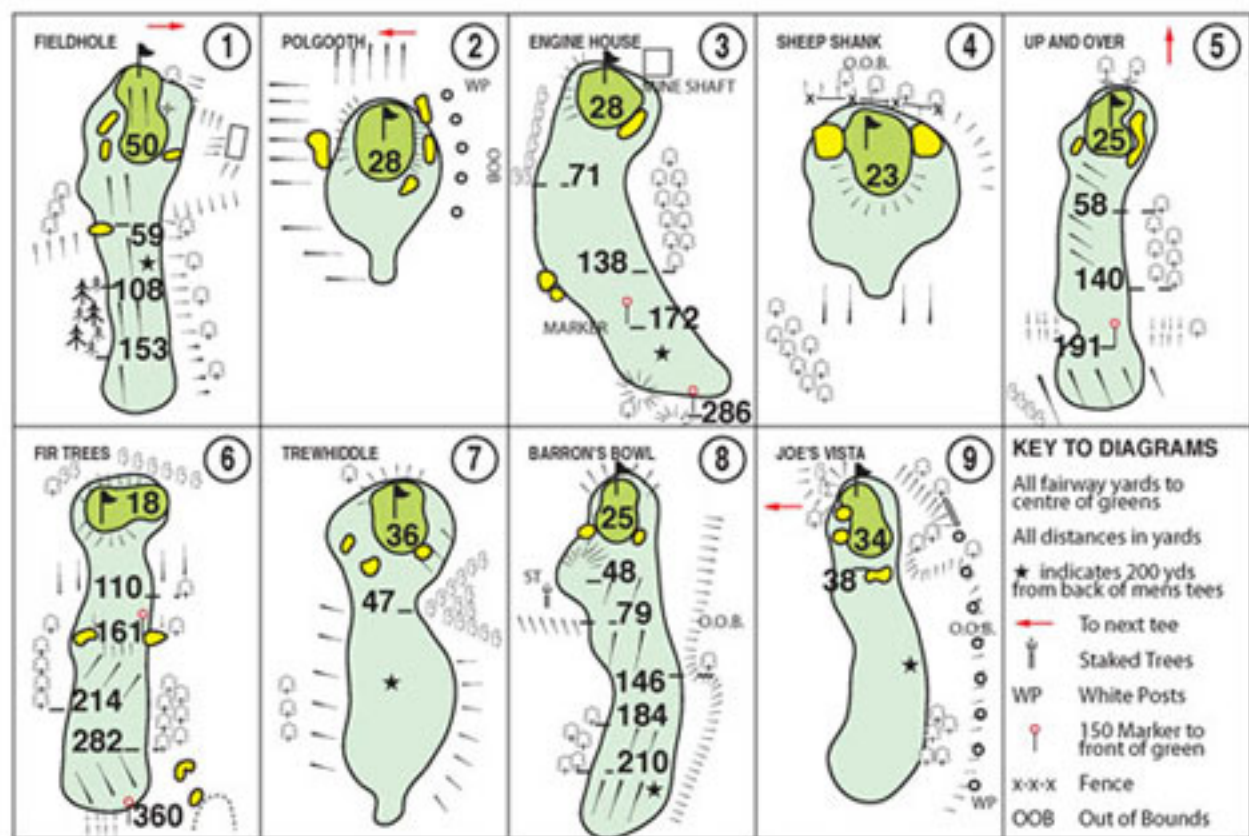

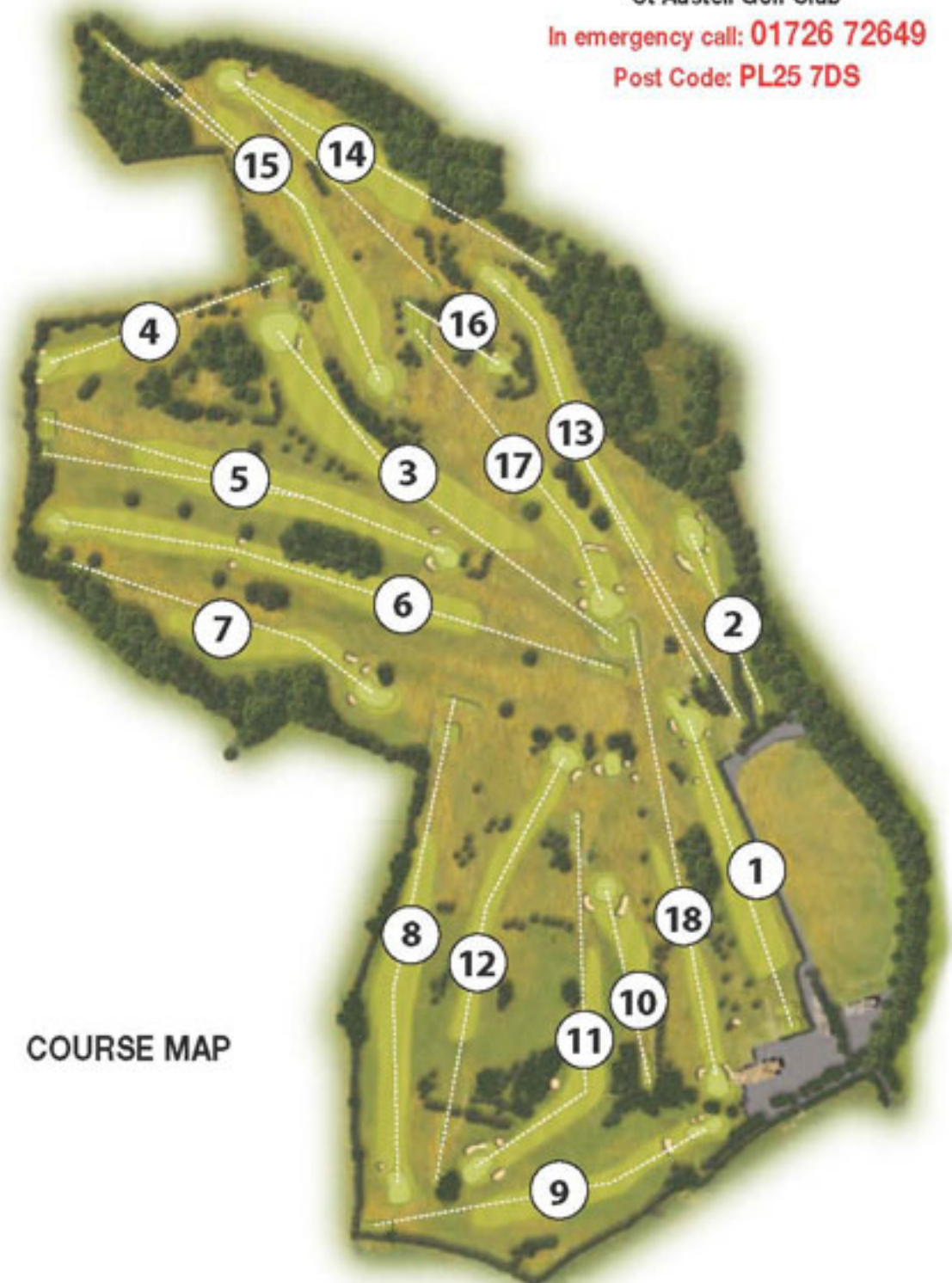

LOCAL RULES

1. OUT OF BOUNDS

A ball is out of bounds when lying:

- Wholly on top of or beyond the boundary hedges of the course and beyond the nearest points at ground level of any stakes defining out of bounds.
- In or on the car park, putting green, patio, paths and flower beds surrounding the Clubhouse, and within the confines of the Clubhouse.
- Within the engine house and mineshafts on the 3rd, 14th and 15th.

2. FIXED SPRINKLER HEADS AND STONE FILLED DRAINS

All fixed sprinkler heads and stone filled drains are immovable obstructions and relief from interference by them may be obtained under Rule 24-2. In addition, if a ball lies off the putting green but not in a hazard and an immovable obstruction on or within two club-lengths of the putting green and within two club-lengths of the ball intervenes on the line of play between the ball and the hole, the player may take relief as follows:

The ball must be lifted and dropped at the nearest point to where the ball lay that (a) is not nearer the hole, (b) avoids intervention and (c) is not in a hazard or on a putting green. The ball may be cleaned when lifted. Relief under this Local Rule is also available if the player's ball lies on the putting green and an immovable obstruction on or within two club-lengths of the putting green intervenes on his line of putt. The player may take relief as follows:

The ball must be lifted and placed at the nearest point where the ball lay that (a) is not nearer the hole, (b) avoids intervention and (c) is not in a hazard. The ball may be cleaned when lifted.

3. PROTECTION OF YOUNG TREES IDENTIFIED BY STAKES

If such a tree interferes with a player's stance or the area of his intended swing, the ball MUST be lifted, without penalty, and dropped in accordance with the procedure prescribed in Rule 24-2b (Immovable Obstruction). The ball may be cleaned when so lifted.

4. PATHS ON COURSE

All artificially made/surfaced pathways are immovable obstructions. Rule 24-2 applies.

5. STONES IN BUNKERS

Stones in bunkers are movable obstructions. Rule 24-1 applies.

6. OVERHEAD WIRES

A ball striking the electric wires or pole on the 9th MUST be replayed without penalty.

7. AERATION HOLES

If a ball comes to rest in an aeration hole, the player may, without penalty, lift the ball and clean it. Through the green, the player shall drop the ball as near as possible to where it lay, but not nearer the hole. On the putting green, the player shall place the ball at the nearest spot not nearer the hole which avoids such situation.

8. INTERNAL HEDGES, WALLS AND FENCE AT REAR OF 4TH GREEN

All internal hedges and walls, including the engine house and wall surrounding the 11th tee, and the fence at the rear of the 4th green are deemed to be integral parts of the course and the ball must be played as it lies or relief taken under Rule 28 (Unplayable Ball). A ball over this fence is out of bounds.

9. GROUND UNDER REPAIR – PLAY PROHIBITED

All temporary greens and the practice bunker by the chipping area are deemed ground under repair from which play is prohibited. If a player's ball lies in the area, or if it interferes with the player's stance or the area of his intended swing, the player must take relief under Rule 25-1, using the Drop Zone if provided.

10. EMBEDDED BALL

Through the green, a ball that is embedded in its own pitch mark in the ground, other than sand, may be lifted without penalty, cleaned and dropped as near as possible to where it lay but not nearer the hole. The ball when dropped must first strike a part of the course through the green.

Exception: A player may not obtain relief under this Local Rule if it is clearly unreasonable for him to make a stroke because of interference by anything other than the condition covered by this Local Rule.

PENALTY FOR BREACH OF LOCAL RULE

Where a Rule of Golf is noted within the Local Rule the penalty for breach of that Local Rule is as stipulated within that Rule. In all other cases the penalty for a breach of a Local Rule is:

MATCH PLAY – Loss of Hole; STROKE PLAY – Two Strokes.

Golfers are reminded they should carry a copy of the 'RULES OF GOLF' at all times and should be conversant with the procedure to follow in the event of any dispute/doubt over a ruling as defined in Rules 2-5 and 3-3.
